3. External Question paper Auditing-End Semester question papers are audited by external academic experts. Based on the feedback given, faculty members ask detailed questions. Students are made to study the subjects in detail so that they become more knowledgeable. Application oriented questions make students to gain knowledge in design. Distribution of valued answer sheets along with key to students (transparency)
