KARE has elected representation on the university's highest governing body. This includes elected representatives from various stakeholder groups such as faculty members, administrative staff, and student bodies, ensuring that diverse perspectives are included in decision-making processes at the institutional level. KARE has a diverse elected representation on the university's highest governing body, the Senate, University Board and the Advisory Board. The Students' Union works in partnership with the University to jointly deliver a great educational experience. The key features of the representative governance structure at KARE as follows:

- 1. **University Academic Senate**: The elected University Academic Senate represents faculty members. It ensures that professors can share their opinions on important academic issues, such as curriculum development and policies. This involvement promotes collaboration and transparency in decision-making.
- 2. **Student Organizations**: Students can elect leaders for various student organizations. These leaders act as representatives, voicing student needs and concerns to the university administration. By participating in these organizations, students can engage in leadership roles, organize events, and advocate for their interests.
- 3. **Employee Communities**: KARE University also supports employee communities to promote staff interests.

Director student affairs supervises the democratic process of Student Council elections every year. The faculty representatives are determined by the representatives elected by each department. From the faculty representatives, the Student Council's elected chairperson is selected. KARE recognises the autonomy of students to establish student unions.
